### PAVILION REFURBISHMENT

Remedial work has been done on the roof and to the external walls. The next task is to replace the flooring during the close season, probably in early March. This is essential to keep the building sound although it is recognised that, in an ideal world, the whole structure is in need of attention.

Informal approaches were made to the Heritage Lottery Fund as the Edwardian frontage is of interest. Whilst sympathy was expressed in general terms, we were advised that any formal application for a grant would be rejected as the village is not in a priority area in terms of social deprivation. This is a key factor in judging what applications to support.

The intention is to try to do as much work as possible in stages to bring improved facilities over the next year or two. Any ideas about different ways of raising finance or thoughts about how to tap into the expertise of club members and friends who might be able to offer practical help will be most welcome. It is felt to be important that our changing rooms are of as high a standard as possible,



given our constraints, to serve the needs of our members and visitors.

Our family membership offer was taken up by a few people last year and the two categories are as follows: Playing member plus spouse and one junior member £22 (in effect the junior member pays nothing) OR Social membership for parents/carers plus one junior member £15.

We hope that this option is worth consideration. Adult members are able to hire the club, subject to availability, free of charge and the facilities include a fully staffed bar and use of the kitchen. We have hosted several wedding anniversaries and birthday celebrations over the past year or two as well as providing a meeting place for other functions.

We are keen to boost all categories of membership and look forward to welcoming new faces as well as those who have been part of the club for several years.

## **INDOOR NETS**

These begin on the 11th of January at Almondbury HS Sports Centre and are on a Sunday morning from 11.00 to 12.00, just in time to work up an appetite for Sunday lunch. Junior members are most welcome to attend and they will receive coaching alongside senior members. The Under 13s will probably have one or two sessions in late March where a separate net will be available for them but they, as well as Under 15 and Under 17 players, are welcome at any of the sessions.

We feel it is important that, whilst there are different priorities involving the various age groups, everyone feels he/she belongs to the same club.

## **SAFETY ISSUES AND YOUNG PLAYERS**

We have always aimed to provide a safe and friendly environment for young players whether on a match day or at the regular Thursday evening practice sessions. All sports are having or have had issues of child safety raised in formal sessions at local and regional levels.

Much of this is, we would like to feel, a matter of common sense but young players have to feel secure and confident that adults who help with coaching or who meet them informally at the club will treat them with respect as befits their status as human beings as well as with particular regard to their age. Some coaches at the club, because of their involvement in education, have been subject to appropriate checks about their fitness to have access to young people and others have been checked, or soon will be, via coaching courses.

The club will appoint a person who will be formally responsible for the welfare of junior members in accordance with national guidelines. Should any issue causing concern arise then this individual will be the first point of contact. Once officially appointed relevant details will be made available.

Whilst we have always had a list of names and addresses and home phone numbers available so that any necessary contact can be made, it is probable that a slightly wider range of information may be asked for at the start of the season.

In addition to the details we already hold, a second contact number in case of emergency will be required as well as brief details (to be kept in strict confidence) of any medical condition regarding, for example, allergies which could be important in the event of any emergency during a match or at a practice.

This may sound a little heavy handed but I hope you understand the reason for passing on the information. We have to be seen to be fully prepared and on the surface little will be different from what has gone on before but there is a requirement to make things a little more formalised and to have procedures in place to deal with any eventualities.
